

ROBERT SAMPLES SCHOLARSHIP

The Kentucky Hereford Association is pleased to support youth, education, and research and will offer \$500 in a college scholarship to a young person who is active in the Hereford breed. This award is in memory of Robert Samples, a past KHA director and great supporter of the Hereford breed and junior breeders. This scholarship is awarded annually to qualified applicants.

PROCEDURES:

Applications should be returned to KHA, 2396 Union City Road, Richmond, KY 40475 with a postmark of June 1 of the calendar year. Upon receipt, a committee will review the applicants. The scholarship recipient will be announced at the Annual meeting in July.

A check will be awarded to the winner after he/she presents evidence of enrollment as a full-time student in accordance with guidelines. In the event that the winner of a scholarship fails to meet enrollment requirements by September 30, the award will be forfeited. Should the recipient fail to complete at least one semester of full-time enrollment in an accredited or approved institution of higher education prior to June 30 of the following year for any reason, money awarded must be refunded to the Robert Samples Scholarship Fund.

QUALIFICATIONS

1. Applicants must have at one time been an American Hereford Junior Association member and must currently be a member of the Kentucky Junior Hereford Association.
2. The applicant must be a graduating high school senior or must be enrolled in a junior college, four-year college/university, or other accredited institution of higher education for the fall term in which the scholarship is to be awarded.
3. The applicant cannot have reached his/her 25th birthday prior to January 1 of the year of application.
4. The scholarship must be applied to undergraduate studies and is applicable to any field of study.

5. The applicant must show proof of enrollment in an institution of higher education before the scholarship award check can be issued. This must be done by September 30 of the calendar year.

INSTRUCTIONS:

All scholarship applications should be typewritten using a typewriter, word processor, or computer to complete the application. Do not add extra pages. Do not use the backs of pages. The font should be no smaller than a 10 point. The application should be in the same format as the official application.

The application may be reproduced on your computer, but the same allotted space must be given to each of the items and questions in the application. The application is 9 pages in length plus information sheets and recommendation sheets. If you have not received all pages, please contact KHA.

For the application to be eligible for review for the scholarship award, the application must include a copy of the most current high school and most current college transcript.

Your application must include 2 letters of recommendation. The letters should include your association with the individual writing the recommendation and a candid evaluation of your abilities, background, character, strengths, weaknesses, etc. The recommendations may come from employers, teachers, ag leaders, junior advisors, pastors, etc.... They may not include applicants or parents. The letters of recommendation may be included with the application or sent to KHA.

June 1st is the absolute deadline for mailing all applications and evaluations. Materials received after this time may preclude an applicant from consideration.

For the application to be eligible for review for the scholarship award, it must include:

- Complete and signed application
- Two letters of recommendation
- Postmarked by June 1st of the application year
- Copy of most current high school and most current college transcript.
